Moral challenges in post-truth times

'We're left out and left behind!' Commentators see this sense as a common thread running through the election of Donald Trump, the Brexit debates and the political turbulence elsewhere in Europe — people feeling deeply disconnected from mainstream politics and economics and ready to turn to unconventional new leaders. But this prompts dark questions. Are we seeing the very ideas of objective facts, truth and reasoned debate under threat? And what next, if the new leaders and configurations do not deliver on their promises?
