A will should be a clear practical expression of our love and concern. It provides us with the opportunity to continue our support for the people and causes we value.

Most of us will want our family to benefit from what we leave behind. With the agreement of your family, you may also wish to leave something to Kingston United Reformed Church. Your legacy will help the church to continue to build on and strengthen its mission to be a welcoming, caring, worshipping Christian community. It will help fund the vital social outreach work which touches some of the most needy in our community.

Wills are legal documents, so it is preferable to have someone legally qualified draft yours for you. You can find a local solicitor through the Law Society – see www.lawsociety.org.uk or call 020 7320 5757. Leaving a proportion of your estate to a charity (such as KURC) can reduce the overall level of inheritance tax due. A solicitor can advise further.

- If you have already have a will you can amend it via a codicil to include KURC;
- If you have yet to write a will, you can list KURC as a beneficiary.

It would not be right for KURC to be involved in a process from which it stands to benefit. However, KURC can provide a suitable form of words for use in detailing the legacy, as recommended by the URC's legal department at Church House.
